# WELCOME TO 2021 INREVIEW

## A WORD FROM OUR ARTISTIC DIRECTOR



It is difficult to recount 2021 other than as a year lived in the shadow of 2020, when COVID-19 changed the world so irrevocably. Barking Gecko was, in many ways, still piecing together shattered plans from the year before and learning to navigate this strange new world. Despite the immense challenges the Live Performance Industry faced globally, we enjoyed a relatively privileged position here in WA, where closed borders meant we could continue, albeit tentatively at times, in a bubble of safety.

It was a year of staying close to home in more ways than one, as Barking Gecko Theatre created and presented our new work, HOUSE. The house has long stood as a symbol of safety, shelter and care, and this new contemporary fairy tale took on added resonances in these challenging times. Part fable, part mad-cap adventure story, **HOUSE** explores loneliness and belonging in the setting of a living, breathing, flying, house. It is a work full of heart and imagination that continues Barking Gecko Theatre's tradition as the home of challenging and ambitious new works for young audiences.

After a premiere season at Perth Festival, HOUSE went on to tour regional WA before returning to Perth for a special encore season. A dedicated schools season followed later in the year. Across 2021 over 18,000 people got to experience the magic of HOUSE. A common response from audiences and critics was that this show felt like "a warm hug", and I can think of nothing audiences needed more this past year.

2021 was also a time of reestablishing interrupted timelines for new works in development, with our artists busily working away on two new works in particular, The Great Un-Wondering of Wilbur Whittaker and Cicada. As part of the creative development of Cicada, we delivered The Cicada Experience workshops into regional communities across WA. This program encapsulates the way Barking Gecko engages with children and communities with children acting as creative consultants on new works whilst they are in development and deep engagement taking place in the communities our shows tour to.

Fresh Ink, a program for emerging playwrights, was delivered for the fifth consecutive year but for the first-time participants developed new plays specifically for young audiences. Delivered in partnership with the Australian Theatre for Young People, this unique program has now given birth to several significant new works that have gone on to premiere across Perth.

In 2021 Barking Gecko expanded School Drama to include a record-number of 32 teachers from 11 schools. A professional learning experience for teachers presented in partnership with Sydney Theatre Company, this extraordinary program continues to inspire small revolutions in classrooms across WA.

2021 was also a year of negotiating internal changes for Barking Gecko. I would like to acknowledge the remarkable contribution Helen Hristofski made to the company during her almost nine years at the helm. Helen's passion for theatre for young audiences is unparalleled and the legacy she leaves behind is the result of an incredible amount of hard work, determination and unwavering belief in the importance of telling complex stories to children.

As Barking Gecko enters its next chapter our purpose remains the same: to create exquisite theatre that encourages children to imagine the world anew. As the world takes its first tentative steps back towards a new type of 'normal', our chance to collectively dream a new world into existence feels more important than ever.

## A WORD FROM OUR **INTERIM BOARD CHAIR**

2021 saw the COVID-19 pandemic continue to sweep the world. At Barking Gecko Theatre, we are acutely conscious of so many people whose families have been impacted by the pandemic, and we extend our sympathies to all those who have experienced devastating

With travel severely curtailed for most of the year, we have been able to focus on developing and nurturing the talent we have here in Western Australia. Barking Gecko Theatre has a responsibility to help build capability within the Western Australian artistic community, and we are pleased to be able to work with such wonderful home-grown talent.

Our major production for the year was HOUSE, a brand-new work that premiered at the Perth Festival. HOUSE is a story of children finding themselves, and finding a place to belong, featuring crazy adventures and a flying house. HOUSE played three seasons in Perth, including a school season where we welcomed children from throughout greater Perth, many of whom had never been to the theatre before. We were also able to take HOUSE on tour to regional communities.

Our Creative Learning work continues to be a cornerstone of our program. As part of this, we developed The Cicada Experience, where children across Western Australia were able to be actively engaged in developing a new show. The children were excited to be part of creating a brand-new work with us, and we hope to welcome many of them to Cicada's premiere in 2022.

During the year, we also farewelled our long-serving CEO and Executive Producer, Helen Hristofski. We thank Ms Hristofski for her many years of service to Barking Gecko Theatre. We have now appointed Ryan Taaffe to the role, previously Executive Director of CircuitWest, the Western Australian presenters' association. Mr Taaffe has a long association with the Western Australian arts and performing arts sector.

We have also strengthened our capability with the appointment of Kaylene Gulich PSM and Amanda Morrison to the Barking Gecko Board. Ms Gulich, CEO of the WA Treasury Corporation, brings a depth of experience in finance and government to the board. Ms Morrison is Head of Global Production of the Komixx Entertainment Group, where she was most recently Executive Producer for the acclaimed young people television series ITCH, filmed in Western Australia.

We take this opportunity to extend our very grateful thanks to all our corporate, government and philanthropic partners, as well as donors. Barking Gecko Theatre exists to bring the joy of live theatre to the children of Western Australia. We are privileged to be able to discharge this mission, but we can't do it without your support. We thank you all for your generosity.

# GECKO ENSEMBLES

Gecko Ensembles are Barking Gecko Theatre's weekly drama classes for children. It's where self-expression leads to self-confidence, as children stretch their imaginations in exciting directions.

Gecko Ensembles focus on the learning that comes from engaging with drama processes. Children question, explore, imagine and create. Through exploring some of life's big questions children develop collaboration and communication skills and build resilience and empathy. They challenge themselves, listen to each other, learn new skills and most importantly, have fun!

Gecko Ensembles celebrate children's diverse ideas, interests and imagination. Children act as our creative consultants, exploring the same content as Barking Gecko's artistic teams are exploring in our rehearsal rooms.

This year, Gecko Ensembles continued to evolve with the establishment of a new Gecko Ensemble in Bunbury and delivered over 8,000 hours of workshops across 8 locations in metropolitan and regional WA.



#### **LITTLE GECKOS** 5 - 7 YEARS

The Little Gecko Ensembles are all about learning through creative play, exploring stories and characters and continuing to foster their curious and courageous imaginations. In this environment children develop confidence in their physical, vocal and imaginative expression through a creatively charged learning environment, as well as having a core focus on ensuring social and emotional wellbeing, building empathy and curiosity.

#### **JUNIOR GECKOS** 8 – 12 YEARS

The Junior Gecko Ensemble is the perfect place for participants to have fun and lose themselves in the joy of drama skills. The Junior Geckos extend their mind, body and imagination as they work as an ensemble to develop new creative ideas and respond to topics presented by Barking Gecko's Teaching Artists. The Junior Gecko Ensemble has a focus on exploring creativity, testing boundaries and ideas all while learning new drama skills.

#### **SENIOR GECKOS** 13 - 17 YEARS

The Senior Gecko Ensemble has a fundamental focus on the discipline of professional practice. Over the course of the year the Senior Gecko Ensemble work on a variety of fundamentals including devising, performance techniques and character development. The Senior Gecko Ensemble is a place where likeminded young people come together and push their capabilities as an ensemble.

Inspired by Shaun Tan's stunning book *Cicada*, this 4-day, drama-based workshop centred around themes of belonging, alienation, freedom, prejudice, self-expression and transformation. Through the eyes of a humble and hard-working Cicada, trapped in the colourless and soul-less world of a multi-storey office block, participants explored and recreated this monochromatic world and Cicada's existence within it, whilst also discovering their own, inner landscape of self-expression.

Engaging in drama processes and techniques, children dove into the unknown to discover new ideas, celebrate the unusual, and get curious about the endless possibilities of creating worlds, exploring characters and discovering stories. Led by Barking Gecko Teaching Artists, the workshops concluded with participants presenting a small showing to parents and families at the end of the four days.

The Cicada Experience returns to engage and inspire additional regional participants in early 2022.

# WORKSHOPS

#### **SCHOOL HOLIDAY WORKSHOPS**

During the school holidays, Barking Gecko Theatre offers children the opportunity to participate in three days of fun drama workshops in a supportive environment. School Holiday Workshops explore a particular theme, idea or question and and are for children aged 5 to 12 years.

These workshops provide a perfect access point for children that have often not participated in a drama class before as well as offering children who regularly engage with drama opportunities to continue to grow their imagination and creativity.

#### **SPECIALIST WORKSHOPS**

Barking Gecko Theatre offers a range of Specialist Workshops to primary and secondary schools and organisations focusing on all aspects of drama. In 2021, we presented tailored workshops on Improvisation, Acting for Teens and Acting for Adults for the City of Karratha, plus specialised offerings at City of Gosnells, Bob Hawke College, Nagle Catholic College, and Holy Spirit Primary School.

This program provides Barking Gecko Theatre with further opportunities to engage with students and communities and to extend participants' creativity in a range of drama processes and techniques.

IN PARTNERSHIP WITH AUSTRALIAN THEATRE FOR YOUNG PEOPLE

For the fifth year running, Barking Gecko Theatre proudly partnered with Australian Theatre for Young People (ATYP) to deliver Fresh Ink, a national mentoring program for emerging playwrights.

The only program of its kind in Australia, Fresh Ink is designed to create opportunities for committed and talented playwrights to bridge the gap into professional practice. It also creates industry links by pairing emerging playwrights with an industry mentor for a series of workshops that result in a script being developed for rehearsal with a cast of actors.

Throughout the year, 4 WA playwrights attended monthly meetings with mentor Will O'Mahony (online and face to face when possible) to hone their skills and build their writing capacity, culminating in the showing of two short works. In 2021, writers were tasked with developing their first script for young audiences presenting to a small audience of industry professionals, family and friends.




