A WORD FROM THE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR



2022 was an exciting and transformative year for Barking Gecko Theatre. Despite the challenges the COVID-19 pandemic continued to present, the company remained adaptable, resilient, and most importantly, creative, producing two new works and a variety of Creative Learning experiences that pushed boundaries, sparked imaginations, and delighted our audiences.

In April we premiered The Great Un-Wondering of Wilbur Whittaker, an inter-galactic adventure for inter-generational audiences that explored the themes of creativity, growing up and living outside of the box- all to the tune of a banging 80's soundtrack. At Barking Gecko, we often talk about "world-building" when we are creating new work, but with Wilbur we were tasked with creating an entire universe on stage. Our talented team of wonderers rose valiantly to the task. After developing this ambitious new work over several years its premiere coincided with the peak of a COVID surge in WA, and it is a testament to the company and the artists involved that we still managed to deliver a successful season to the warm appreciation of audiences and peers. Not only that, but Wilbur then set off on a tour of regional WA.

July saw the premiere of *Cicada*, an adaptation of Shaun Tan's exquisite, award winning book. With Shaun's generous blessing, co-adaptors Arielle Gray, Tim Watts and I were encouraged to follow our curiosity and expand upon the original story to discover how it lived and breathed theatrically.

A small-scale puppetry work with a very big heart, audiences fell in love with the little green guy – with a sold-out (extended) premiere season, sold-out schools' season, and regional tour of WA to follow. It was particularly rewarding for the show to travel back to the communities who engaged in *The Cicada Experience* workshops in 2021, demonstrating Barking Gecko's commitment to deep engagement with our audiences.

Off the stage, our Creative Learning programs continued to care for the creativity of young people wherever they may be. Gecko Ensembles, our weekly drama workshops, continued across WA and School Drama, our professional learning program for teachers (presented in partnership with Sydney Theatre Company), continued to create small revolutions inside classrooms. Behind the scenes, our artists worked away in the rehearsal room developing a major new work for the company that will premiere in the coming years.

There is no collective noun for a group of Geckos (they tend to operate solo!) but I often wonder if a "magnificence of Gecko's" would be an apt description – especially when it comes to the team at Barking Gecko Theatre. 2022 was in many ways the most challenging year of the pandemic so far, and our small but mighty team went above and beyond to deliver on our mission of creating exceptional theatre for young audiences.

To nurture and feed the imaginations of children and young people is an act of great responsibility, and of great necessity. The theatre offers young people a space like no other - a place of togetherness, where time slows down, attention is cultivated, and imaginations are expanded. It is a place of hope. We are grateful for the ongoing support from our funders, partners, and community to create that space for as many children as we possibly can and look forward to continuing our journey of artistic exploration and unbridled imagination well into the future.

At Barking Gecko Theatre, we believe when children's creativity is nurtured, their potential is endless!

Gecko Ensembles are Barking Gecko Theatre's weekly drama classes for children. It's where self-expression leads to self-confidence, as children stretch their imaginations in exciting directions.

Gecko Ensembles focus on the learning that comes from engaging with drama processes. Children question, explore, imagine, and create. Through exploring some of life's big questions children develop collaboration and communication skills and build resilience and empathy. They challenge themselves, listen to each other, learn new skills and most importantly, have fun!

Gecko Ensembles celebrate children's diverse ideas, interests, and imagination. Children act as our creative consultants, exploring the same content as Barking Gecko's artistic teams are exploring in our rehearsal rooms.

Classes are facilitated by our Teaching Artists, who are accomplished industry professionals, passionate in helping young people discover their potential through drama.

LITTLE GECKOS 5 - 7 YEARS

The Little Gecko Ensembles are all about learning through highly structured drama activities. Children develop confidence in their physical, vocal, and imaginative expression through a series of exciting exercises in a fun and creative learning environment. Class sizes for Little Geckos are capped to a maximum of 16 to ensure individual attention on each child.

JUNIOR GECKOS 8 - 12 YEARS

Our Junior Gecko Ensemble is the perfect place for children to have fun and lose themselves in the joy of drama, while also refining social, emotional, and creative skills. Ensemble members enjoy extending themselves as they delve into the craft of acting, learning new drama skills, developing characters, play making and script interpretation.

SENIOR GECKOS YEAR 7 - 10

The Senior Gecko Ensemble is all about building drama skills and professional practice in an environment of imagination and possibility. Over the year this ensemble will explore acting fundamentals and a range of theatre devising techniques, in a playful, supportive, and professional environment.

DRAMA WORKSHOPS

SCHOOL HOLIDAY WORKSHOPS

During the school holidays, Barking Gecko Theatre offers children the opportunity to participate in three days of fun drama workshops in a supportive

environment. School Holiday Workshops explore a particular theme, idea or question and are for children aged 5 to 12 years.

These workshops provide a perfect access point for children that have often not participated in a drama class before as well as offering children who regularly engage with drama opportunities to continue to grow their imagination and creativity.

SPECIALIST WORKSHOPS

Barking Gecko Theatre offers a range of specialist workshops in primary and secondary schools, as well as community organisations. These programs can range in delivery from a 90-minute workshop through to a multi-day immersive experience, focusing on aspects of drama including character, improvisation, physical and specialist theatre.

We additionally tailor workshops specific to individual requirements, developed in consultation with teachers in schools, and community development/engagement and arts and culture teams in organisations including local governments. These programs provide BGT with opportunities to engage with students and educators, and communities across Western Australia to extend and enhance engagement in arts and creativity through a range of drama processes and techniques.




